In the last five years, the Parkinson's Foundation has invested **\$1,422,100** in research, better care, and education + empowerment for the **North Carolina Parkinson's disease (PD) community**.

IMPROVING CARE

- Trained **1,310** health professionals
- Offered help through **2,540** calls to our Helpline
- Distributed **45,050** free publications in English and Spanish
- Funded **two Centers of Excellence**
(University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill School of Medicine | Duke Health Movement Disorders Center)

Treated **4,400** people at our Centers of Excellence

5 people enrolled in the Parkinson's Outcomes Project, the largest clinical study of PD



RESEARCH

- **1** researcher received a grant totaling **\$300,000**
- **10** research advocates paired with scientists to make research more effective



EDUCATION AND EMPOWERMENT

- **1,695** Aware in Care kits prepared people for the hospital
- **1,650** people received free services through 5 community grants totaling **\$332,150**
- **5,900** people walked for Parkinson's and raised **\$1,418,200** through Moving Day
