CAROLINAS

In the last five years, the Parkinson's Foundation has invested **\$1,100,800** in research, better care, and education + empowerment for the **Carolinas Chapter Parkinson's Disease (PD) Community**.



IMPROVING CARE

- Trained **1,410** health professionals
- Offered help through **3,620** calls to our Helpline
- Distributed **62,120** free publications in English and Spanish
- Funded **three Centers of Excellence**

(Duke Health Movement Disorders Center | University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill School of Medicine | Medical University of South Carolina)

Treated **6,510** people at our Centers of Excellence

120 enrolled in the Parkinson's Outcomes Project, the largest clinical study of PD



RESEARCH

- **3** researchers received grants totaling **\$410,000**
- **5** research advocates paired with scientists to make research more effective and **10** ambassadors were trained to help change policies around PD care in hospitals

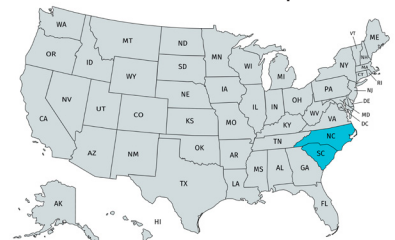


EDUCATION AND EMPOWERMENT

- **2,850** Aware in Care kits prepared people for the hospital
- **2,460** people participated in educational programs, and hundreds more viewed on-line
- **1,500** people received free services through 27 community grants totaling **\$219,100**
- **4,280** people walked for Parkinson's and raised **\$1,724,000** through Moving Day
