In the last 5 years, the Parkinson's Foundation has invested \$1,538,007 in research, better care, and education & empowerment for the NORTH CAROLINA AND SOUTH CAROLINA Parkinson's Disease (PD) Community

#### IMPROVING CARE



- Trained 1,406 health professionals
- Offered help through 3,737 calls to our Helpline
- Distributed 65,272 free publications in English and Spanish
- Raised \$683,770 in funding for our Centers of Excellence

## RESEARCH



- 3 researchers received grants totaling \$410,000
- 17 research advocates paired with scientists to make research more effective and 9 ambassadors trained to help change policies around PD care in hospitals

### **EDUCATION AND EMPOWERMENT**

• 2,986 Aware in Care kits prepared people for the hospital



- 4,163 people participated in educational programs, and hundreds more viewed online
- 2,440 people received free services through 29 community grants totallying \$255,643
- 4,278 people walked for Parkinson's and raised \$1,506,874 through Moving Day

#### TREATMENT AND PREVALENCE



- 36,265 people with PD live in the Carolinas Chapter and amass \$1.81B in expenses related to PD
- 271 participants enrolled in the Parkinson's Outcomes Project, the largest clinical study of PD
- Treated 40,687 people at our Centers of Excellence
