RESEARCH

- 2 researchers received grants totaling \$200,000
- 10 ambassadors were trained to help change policies around PD care in hospitals



EDUCATION AND EMPOWERMENT

- 3,160 Aware in Care kits prepared people for the hospital
- 2,540 people participated in educational programs, and hundreds more viewed on-line
- 1,210 people received free services through 7 community grants totaling \$62,100
- 5,310 people walked for Parkinson's and raised \$1,243,300 through Moving Day
